

Dr. Jonathan Lee Walton is the Dean of the Divinity School at Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. His latest book, *A Lens of Love: Reading the Bible in Its World for Our World*, blends his work from the pulpit and classroom - exploring the Bible from the perspective of the most vulnerable and violated characters toward the development of a Christian social ethic of radical inclusion and human affirmation.

Prior to joining the Wake Forest community, Dean Walton served as the Plummer Professor of Christian Morals and Pusey Minister in the Memorial Church at Harvard University. Along with serving as the Dean of the School of Divinity, Dean Walton also occupies the Presidential Chair in Religion and Society and is the inaugural Dean of Wait Chapel at Wake Forest.

Dean Walton is married to Cecily Cline and they are the parents of Zora Neale, Elijah Mays, and Baldwin Cline.
