

Reverend David Wesley Carroll is a retired United Methodist minister and since 2006 a consultant at Ministry Architects, a church consulting and project management firm based in Brentwood, Tennessee. Born in Memphis, the son of a Methodist parsonage family, David grew up in North Mississippi, graduating from Tupelo High School in 1974. At Millsaps, he majored in sociology, and following graduation in 1978, went on to complete an M.Div. at the Candler School of Theology, Emory University. During his career as a minister, he served congregations in Corinth, Columbus, Winona, and three in the Jackson area. David served on the Camping Ministries Committee of the Mississippi Conference of the UMC 1992-2015, which he chaired for 15 years; and on the board of Camp Lake Stephens in Oxford, where he chaired longrange planning efforts in the early 1990s. He was previously a member of the Advisory Board on Church and College Relations at Millsaps, served as a member of the Presidential Search Committee in 2000, and currently serves on the College Board of Trustees. David is married to Laura Smith Carroll, and they are the parents of three married Children: Ben Carroll (Brooke), Kathryn Carroll Barham (Ben), and Mary Evelyn Carroll (Charley Rowe). And they have most recently become proud grandparents of Emmy and Giles.
