The Meditation of Preparation

[W]hen you first begin to undertake contemplation, all that you find is a darkness, a sort of cloud of unknowing.... This darkness and cloud is always between you and your God, no matter what you do, and it prevents you from seeing God clearly by the light of understanding and from experiencing God in the sweetness of love in your affection. So set yourself to rest in this darkness as long as you can, always crying out after God whom you love. For if you are to experience God or see God at all, insofar as it is possible here, it must always be in this cloud and in this darkness.
