

What It Means to Be Human: Studies in Genesis

Tonight, October 6, 20 and 27

Few books in the Bible have captured the imagination of readers through the generations like the Book of Genesis. Placed at the beginning of scripture, it tells a story of creation that echoes out through all that is to come. Scott is leading us in taking a closer look at the opening eleven chapters of Genesis, which we often take to be the story of creation and humanity's beginnings. Yet we are considering how these founding stories aim to tell us not simply from where we have come, but who we are in the present.
