Now. Here. This.

Writer and lay theologian Marilynne Robinson argues that for all our modern questioning and search for meaning, we often fail to appreciate the "givenness of things."

"Givenness" is a philosophical term that refers to that which is "assumed" or "granted," as in the "givenness of human nature" or the "givenness that the choir will sound great on Sunday morning." "Givenness" is what's there when we start.

Robinson argues that today's dominant worldview has an undue suspicion of the givenness of things in a way that previous generations would have found absurd. We imagine coming into the world with a blank slate. Whatever preceded us is of no consequence. Whatever comes after is of no concern. While we're here, the loudest voice often decides what's true. More and more, it seems, our focus is not on what we are "given" but on what we can take.

For a Christian person, much in life is understood to be *given*. The love and grace of God are given. God's provision, mercy, and hope (perhaps even God's sense of humor!)—all given. We can assume all of these things are as real and true as the day is long and live life accordingly. Some days, this is harder to do than others. On other days, it is absolutely essential.

Times of trial or crisis, when we question what is real or true, require a stubborn memory to widen our view beyond the present moment. It's often in seasons when what we have taken as given seems insufficient that we must hold these promises even closer.

Of course, to say that life is *given* is also to say that life is a *gift*. This is why the great medieval Christian writer and mystic Meister Eckhart once wrote, "If the only prayer you say in your life is 'thank you,' that would be enough." It would be cliché if it weren't so true. Gratitude is at the very heart of faith.

The givenness of life, the giftedness of life. Each proceeds from the other, and taken together, they are the table and chairs for the great Thanksgiving feast to which we're all invited. All we're asked to do is find our seat. SHD

Personal Care Homes are private homes for individuals with mental disabilities. These individuals do not qualify for state hospitalization, and many of the residents exchange their Social Security check for room and board, so there is no money available for any extras. Some are in quite difficult circumstances. All of them appreciate a thoughtful visit and gift. On Sunday, December 8, we will gather in the Great Hall and assemble all of our gifts into individual bags: a blanket, toiletries, warm socks, and cookies baked by you. We will then divide into teams and deliver the gifts to every personal care home resident in Jackson. Usually, we are finished by 3:30 p.m.

This is a wonderful intergenerational opportunity for the entire church family to participate in our community together.
