Today is the fifth Sunday in Lent. Lent is the season in which we anticipate Jesus' final trip to Jerusalem and the self-giving nature of love shown in his Passion and death. The season begins with Ash Wednesday and extends for forty weekdays through Saturday of Holy Week. Sundays are excluded from Lent, being regarded as feast days in the midst of the forty-day fast. Because Lent is the most strongly penitential season of the year, the liturgical color is purple.

Our Lenten banner is a visual symbol of Christ's sacrifice. The images of the cross, thorns, and spear remind us of his agony on our behalf. The pattern is broken, reminding us of the power of the cross, the disruption of evil, and a life broken for us. The purple recalls the penitential color of Lent and the red reminds us of sacrifice.

The banner was designed and made by a Northminster member.

In observance of the Lenten season, only candles and the Bible will be placed on the communion table, reminding us of this prayerful Lenten journey until the grace of Easter blooms again.

**The Northminster Choir presents
The Seven Last Words of Christ**

Sunday, March 29, 5:30 p.m.

Théodore Dubois (1837-1924) composed "The Seven Last Words of Christ" in 1867 for his choir in Paris. The work is scored for full orchestra, chorus and soloists, and contains eight movements. The work opens with a soprano solo that utilizes a traditional text sung at Tenebrae services: "O all you who pass by the way, attend and see if there be any sorrow like to my sorrow." The text originates from Lamentations 1:12, originally describing the destruction of Jerusalem, but heavily adapted in Christian tradition to depict the suffering of Christ on the cross or the sorrow of the Virgin Mary. It is the sorrow of Mary that Dubois points

toward. It acts as a meditation on the Passion, inviting believers to empathize with the intense grief of Christ.

Successive movements two through eight take one of Christ's final utterances and combine chorus and soloists into a dramatic narrative supported by full orchestra. Following the Seventh Word with its dramatic sudden darkness and earthquake, Dubois concludes his sacred cantata with a hymn-like setting of the medieval antiphon Adoramus Te, Christe. The contrast with the immediately preceding music and compelling drama of the Passion story provides a foretaste of the resurrection.
